## NEW BUSINESS

## Math Club Proposal

Given the popularity of the Math Club Program implemented last year, Becca and Kris are proposing programming for this school year. The club would involve 2 eight-week sessions, one in the fall and one in the spring. The goal is to work with as many students is possible. Sessions would be designated for groupings of Grades 1-2 and Grades 3-4.

The costs of the proposal include:
$\$ 400$ - personnel for program coordination/facilitation
\$320 - personnel for program assistance
\$100 - program supplies (\$50 per session)

## Youth Beats program with Rich Regione

Kris Briand presented a proposal to implement the "Youth Beats" afterschool program. Rich Reggione, a national touring professional drummer, will be facilitating a 12 week after school enrichment program for students in grades 1-4. The program "builds creative expression through the use of percussion instruments." Details of the program were explained. The program will run mid-January through mid-April.

## Reading Program Proposal
